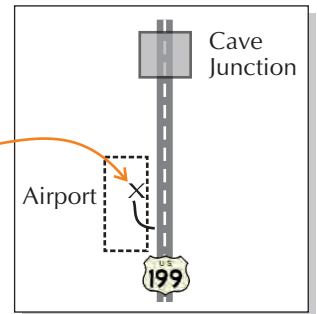
A dedication ceremony will be held at historic Siskiyou Smokejumper Base to commemorate Oregon's aerial firefighter history. Siskiyou Smokejumper Base was Oregon's first aerial firefighter operation and one of the first four bases in American history. Oregon's smokejumper history includes a segregated African American military unit, conscientious objectors working as smokejumpers during WWII, the Apollo 14 moon tree story, the smallest smokejumper in American history, and more.

Located on Smokejumper Way at Illinois Valley Airport, four and a half miles south of Cave Junction.

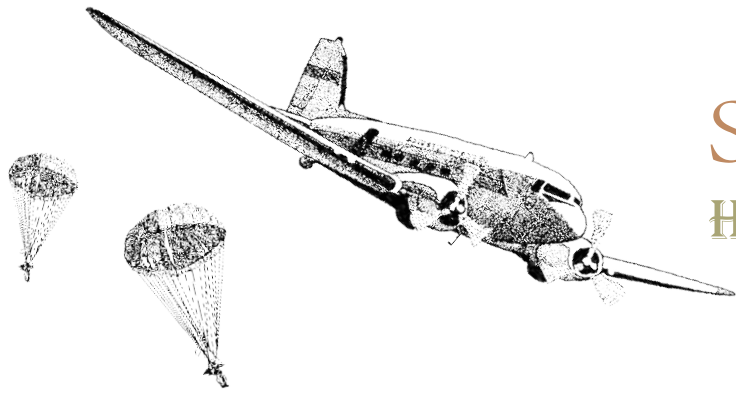

ADVISORY — Do not allow children to climb or sit on aircraft. Stay out of and away from air operation areas. Seating is limited - folding chairs are recommended for those planning to stay for the entire event. Ground is uneven in some places - wear sturdy shoes. Some historic walls are loose rock and unstable - keep children off. A small creek passes through the grounds with fast moving water. Watch children at all times.

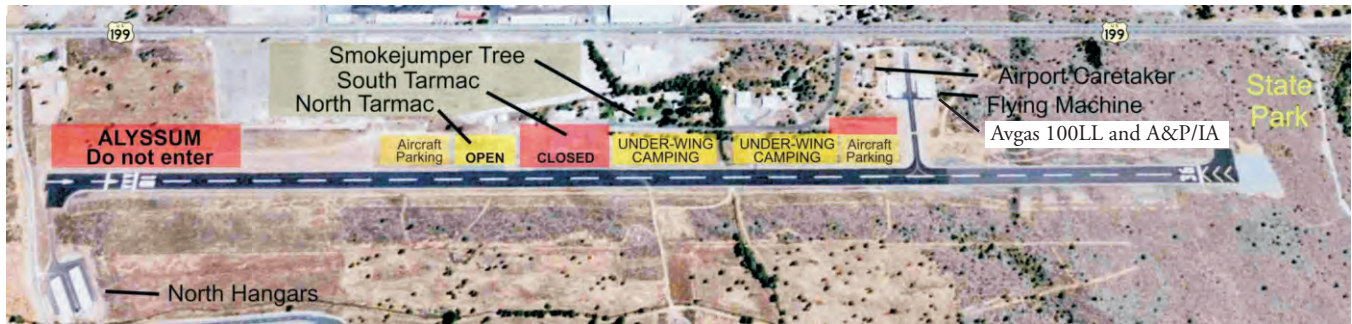

PILOT ADVISORY

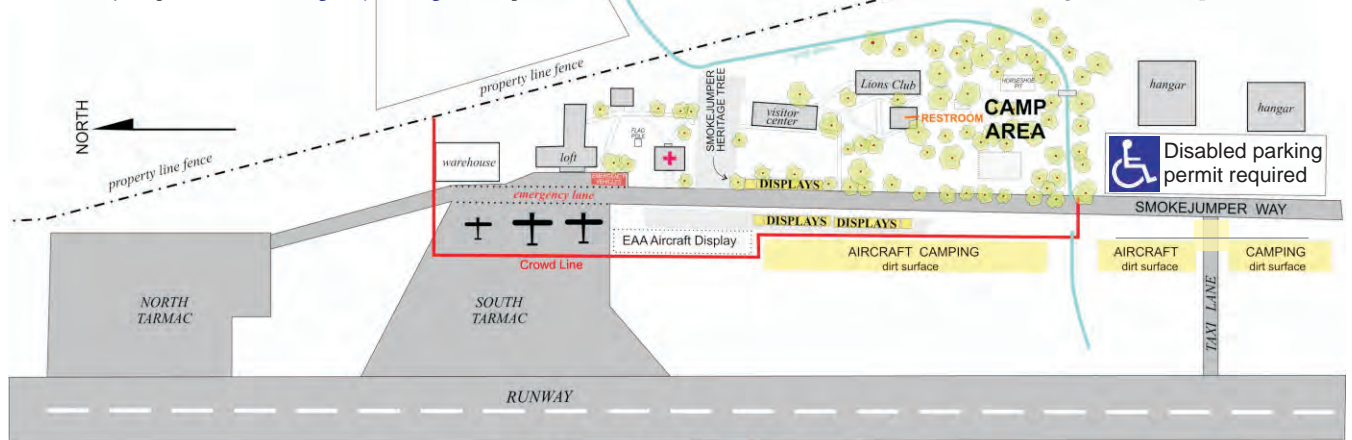
